

At a *Regular* meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Duaneburg, Schenectady County, New York, held at the Town Garage in the Town of Duaneburg, New York, on the 8th day of June, 1950, at eight o'clock, P.M., D.S.T., there were:

Justice *Mc Dougall* offered the following resolution and order and moved its adoption:

WHEREAS heretofore and on the 5th day of April, 1950, a petition signed and acknowledged or proved in the same manner as a deed to be recorded by resident taxpayers owning taxable real property aggregating at least one-half of the assessed valuation of all the taxable real property of the proposed Fire District No. 2 of the Town of Duaneburg, owned by resident taxpayers, as such valuations appear upon the latest completed assessment roll of the Town of Duaneburg, was presented to and filed with the Town Board of the Town of Duaneburg, and

WHEREAS a public hearing upon said petition was duly held by the Town Board of the Town of Duaneburg on April 26th, 1950, notice thereof having been duly published at least once in the Schenectady Union-Star, a newspaper having general circulation in the territory affected, the first publication thereof being not less than ten days nor more than twenty days before the day designated therein for the hearing, and

WHEREAS the Town Clerk of the Town of Duaneburg did cause five copies of such notice to be posted conspicuously in

different premises within the territory affected not less than ten nor more than twenty days before the day designated for the hearing as aforesaid, and

WHEREAS said notice did contain a description of the proposed district and did specify the time when and the place where the Town Board of the Town of Duanesburg will meet to consider said petition and to hear all persons interested in the subject concerning the same, and

WHEREAS the Town Board of the Town of Duanesburg, in accordance with said notice, did meet on April 20th, 1950, and did hold a public hearing upon said petition and did hear all persons interested in the subject concerning the same, and

WHEREAS the proposed district as set forth in said petition is described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the center line of the Duanesburg-Quaker St. Rd. SH #5551 (route #7), said point being distant 1032 feet east of the intersection of the center lines of said Route #7 and Cole Rd.; thence in a northwesterly direction and in a straight line to the point of intersection of the center lines of the Duanesburg-Esperance Rd. SH #1454 (Route #20) and the Mudge Rd.; thence northerly and in a straight line along the center of Mudge Rd. to a point where the continuation of said line intersects the division line between Election Dists. #1 and #3; thence easterly along the boundary line of Election Dists. #1 and #3 to the point of intersection between the center line of the Princetown Church Rd. and the dividing line between Towns of Duanesburg and Princetown, said point being the northeasterly corner of Election Dist. #3; thence in a southerly, easterly and southerly direction along the said Town line to the boundary line between Albany and Schenectady Counties, said point being the southeasterly corner of Election Dist. #3; thence in a westerly direction along said County boundary to the point of intersection with the East boundary of Quaker St. Fire Dist. #1; thence northerly along Quaker St. Fire Dist. #1 to the point of intersection of the Cole Road and Route #7, thence easterly along Route #7 to the point of beginning;

and

WHEREAS Arthur Ferguson, Chairman of the Board of Assessors of the Town of Duanesburg, did certify in writing that

the assessed valuation of all taxable real property in said district, as shown upon the assessment rolls of the Town of Duanesburg for the year 1949, is \$672,572.00, and that the assessed valuation of all the taxable real property of said district owned by resident owners, according to said assessment rolls, is \$326,200.00, and that the aggregate assessed valuation of the taxable real property situated in the proposed Duanesburg Fire District No. 2 owned by resident owners residing in the Town of Duanesburg who have signed said petition is \$216,850.00, being more than one-half of the assessed valuation of all the taxable real property in said district owned by resident owners, according to said assessment rolls of the Town of Duanesburg for the year 1949, and

WHEREAS the Town Board on April 20th, 1950, after a hearing held upon the notice given as aforesaid and upon the evidence given thereat, by resolution of the Town Board determined:

- (a) That said petition is signed and acknowledged or proved as required by law and is otherwise sufficient;
- (b) That all the property and the property owners within the proposed Fire District No. 2 of the Town of Duanesburg are benefited thereby;
- (c) That all the property and property owners benefited are included within the limits of the proposed Fire District No. 2 of the Town of Duanesburg; and
- (d) That it is in the public interest to grant in whole the relief sought;

and

WHEREAS this Town Board on April 20th, 1950, duly and unanimously adopted a resolution approving the establishment of Fire District No. 2 of the Town of Duanesburg and authorizing and directing an application for permission to create and establish said Fire District No. 2 of the Town of Duanesburg to be filed in the office of the State Department of Audit and

Control, at Albany, New York, in accordance with section 173 of the Town Law, and

WHEREAS the Honorable Frank C. Moore, Comptroller of the State of New York, on May 23 1950, did duly grant an order permitting the creation and establishment of Fire District No. 2 of the Town of Duanesburg,

NOW, THEREFORE, after due deliberation thereon, it is hereby:

DETERMINED, ORDERED AND DIRECTED that the following described area within the Town of Duanesburg, Schenectady County, New York, be and it is hereby created and established as Fire District No. 2 of the Town of Duanesburg:

Beginning at a point in the center line of the Duanesburg-Quaker St. Rd. SH #5551 (route #7), said point being distant 1032 feet east of the intersection of the center lines of said Route #7 and Cole Rd.; thence in a northwesterly direction and in a straight line to the point of intersection of the center lines of the Duanesburg-Resperance Rd. SH #1454 (Route #20) and the Mudge Rd.; thence northerly and in a straight line along the center of Mudge Rd. to a point where the continuation of said line intersects the division line between Election Dists. #1 and #3; thence easterly along the boundary line of Election Dists. #1 and #3 to the point of intersection between the center line of the Princetown Church Rd. and the dividing line between Towns of Duanesburg and Princetown, said point being the northeasterly corner of Election Dist. #3; thence in a southerly, easterly and southerly direction along the said Town line to the boundary line between Albany and Schenectady Counties, said point being the southeasterly corner of Election Dist. #3; thence in a westerly direction along said County boundary to the point of intersection with the East boundary of Quaker St. Fire Dist. #1; thence northerly along Quaker St. Fire Dist. #1 to the point of intersection of the Cole Road and Route #7, thence easterly along Route #7 to the point of beginning;

and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND RESOLVED that a certified copy of this order and resolution be duly recorded in the office of the Clerk of the County of Schenectady, New York, forthwith.
