Local Law No. 1 of the year 2003

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING AND SUPERSEDING REAL PROPERTY TAX LAW SECTION 458-a INCLUDING GOLD STAR PARENT WITHIN THE DEFINITION OF "QUALIFIED OWNER" AND INCLUDING PROPERTY OWNED BY A GOLD STAR PARENT WITHIN THE DEFINITION OF "QUALIFYING RESIDENTIAL REAL PROPERTY" FOR PURPOSES OF THE ALTERNATIVE VETERANS EXEMPTION.

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Duanesburg as follows:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. AUTHORITY

This local law is enacted pursuant to the authority of Chapter 326 of the laws of 2000, §1, effective August 23, 2000, constituting Chapter 50-A of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York, authorizing towns to adopt a local law to include a Gold Star Parent within the definition of "qualified owner", as provided in paragraph (c) of subdivision one of section 458-a of the Real Property Tax Law, and to include property owned by a Gold Star Parent within the definition of "qualifying residential real property" as provided in paragraph (d) of subdivision one of section 458-a of the Real Property Tax Law, provided that such property shall be the primary residence of the Gold Star Parent, for purposes of the alternative veterans exemption.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE

In light of the sacrifice made by gold star parents, it is deemed advantageous by the Town Board of the Town of Duanesburg to enact a local law superseding Real Property Tax Law Section 458-a to amend paragraphs (c) and (d) of subdivision 1 to include Gold Star Parent within the class of individuals eligible to apply for the alternative veterans real property tax exemption.

SECTION 3.

Insofar as Real Property Tax Law Section 458-a(1)(c) and (d) applies to the Town of Duanesburg, said law is hereby amended and superseded in its application to the Town of Duanesburg as follows:

(c) "Qualified Owner" means a veteran, the spouse of a veteran, a Gold Star Parent or the unremarried surviving spouse of a veteran. Where property is owned

by more than one qualified owner, the exemption to which each is entitled may be combined. Where a veteran is also the unremarried surviving spouse of a veteran, such person may also receive any exemption to which the deceased spouse was entitled.

(d) "Qualifying residential real property" means property owned by a qualified owner which is used exclusively for residential purposes; provided, however, that in the event any portion of such property is not so used exclusively for residential purposes but is used for other purposes, such portion shall be subject to taxation and the remaining portion only shall be entitled to the exemption provided by this section. Such property must be the primary residence of the veteran, a Gold Star Parent or unremarried surviving spouse of the veteran, unless the veteran, Gold Star Parent or unremarried surviving spouse is absent from the property due to medical reasons or institutionalization. In the event the veteran dies and there is no unremarried surviving spouse, "qualifying residential real property" shall mean the primary residence owned by a qualified owner prior to death, provided that the title to the property becomes vested in the dependent father or mother or dependent child or children under twenty-one years of age of a veteran by virtue of devise by or descent from the deceased qualified owner, provided that the property is the primary residence of one or all of the devisees.

SECTION 4. VALIDITY

See Real Property Tax Law Section 458-a(7), effective as of August 23, 2000.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE

This local law shall be effective January 1, 2004.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Section 458-a of the Real Property Tax Law provides for the alternative veterans real property tax exemption for a veteran, the spouse of a veteran or the unremarried surviving spouse of a veteran; and

WHEREAS, Section 458-a(1)(7)(b) authorizes a town to adopt a local law to expand the exemption to include a Gold Star Parent, that is, a parent of a child who died in the line of duty while serving in the United States armed forces during a period of war, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Duanesburg desires to provide for the alternative veterans real property tax exemption for the primary residence of a Gold Star Parent by local law; and

WHEREAS, on August 14, 2003, the Town Board of the Town of Duanesburg resolved to hold a public hearing at the Duanesburg Town Hall at 7:15 p.m. on September 11, 2003 on the adoption of a Local Law to expand the alternative veterans real property tax exemption to include Gold Star Parents; and

WHEREAS, notice of the public hearing was published in the Daily Gazette on ______, 2003 and posted on the official Town sign board on ______, 2003; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Law § 20(5), the Town held a public hearing on the adoption of the Local Law on September 11, 2003 at 7:15 p.m. at Duanesburg Town Hall; and

NOW, THEREFORE, it is resolved that the Town Board of the Town of Duanesburg hereby adopts Local Law No. _ of the year of 2003, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and she hereby is directed to enter said Local Law in the minutes of this meeting and in the Local Law Book of the Town of Duanesburg, and give due notice of the adoption of said Local Law to the Secretary of State.
