Present was Council-members Merrihew, Potter, Plue, Pneuman, Supervisor Wall, and Attorney Fassett.

In the absence of Town Clerk Lennon, Ellen Grasek was recording Secretary.

Public hearing on Local Law 1 for the year 2000

A Local Law relating to Prohibiting Commercial Ventures of all kinds on the waters of Mariaville Lake. Was called to order at 7:30 P.M. by Supervisor Wall.

Supervisor Wall read the Legal notice as posted on March 16, 2000

Supervisor Wall opened the meeting to comments.

Councilman Plue read Local Law # 1 as proposed, adding section 3A providing for exemptions because the nature of the Local law was too strict.

Bob Cuttita, Mariaville Lake - Thanked the Town Board for taking this matter seriously.

Doug Yauchler, Quaker Street - Expressed favor of restriction, and was in favor of the exemption for day permits. He stated that this is a good thing and it halts commercialism.

Richard Gally, Mariaville - Stated that this was a marvelous ideas and thanked Mr. Cuttita and his father for their perseverance.

All those wishing to be heard, having been heard the public hearing on Local Law #1 was closed at 7:40 P.M.

Supervisor Wall read the Legal Notice dated March 16, 2000 regarding legal weight limits for Posted Town Roads by order of Superintendent of Highways William Grimm, Jr.

Supervisor Wall opened the floor for comments. No comments the floor was closed at 7:41 P.M.

Regular Meeting Town Board of Duanesburg was called to order at 7:41 P.M.

Pledge to the flag was led by Supervisor Wall.

Sergeant Jovanovitch of the State Police was present to discuss concerns that Town residents may have in regards to the Trooper Station being moved six miles east on Route 7. He informed the Board that the need for more equipment and staff resulting from 911 necessitated the move to larger quarters. The move to the Old Charlew building, now owned by Town of Princetown was strictly a financial decision. He also stated that the presence of the airport in Duanesburg prevented the building of a suitable radio communications tower. The move should take place in late June and all services will remain the same.

Supervisor Wall asked if anyone had any comments on the agenda.

George Lent, Route 7 - Questioned whether a Public Hearing would be held on the Sewer District, stating that informational meetings for property owners should be held. Wanted to know how much money the Town put away from sales tax revenue and mortgage tax revenue.

Supervisor Wall explained the difference between informational meetings and public hearings and that the required public hearings had been held. He also stated that only people served by the sewer district pay for the sewer district and putting money away would be illegal.

No further comment on the agenda the floor was closed.

George Lent- Route 7 - Inquired regarding the need for a Deputy Animal Control Officer, his salary, and the need for an Animal Control Law. Harvey Nolan, Animal Control officer, replied that there are more exotic animals now than just dogs and cats, and that the current law does not address that. Mr. Shephard will not receive a salary.

Mr. Lent also inquired as to the fact that the sewer district may create a hardship for some people and that the Town Board should try and find more grant money.

Roland Salisburg - Burtonsville - Stated that the School District does not need sewers and are being made to finance the cost. He was annoyed that the Village voted for this and only they need it and now the whole School District is required to pay for that system. He feels that all the Duanesburg School residents should have been able to vote on the sewer system. Supervisor Wall stated that there is a long history concerning the need for sewers and that they have been discussed since the 70's.

Bob Cuttita, Mariaville - commented that if Delanson did not want the sewers, Mariaville residents do.

Barney Waldron, Mariaville - commented that people need to work together for the betterment of the community.

Fred Brasmeister - had questions about whether the road near his property is abandoned or not. He would like the town to provide some man power and equipment to fix the road. Supervisor Wall requested that he document his claim in writing and that the Board would review it at a later date and comment on it.

Tim Aragona, Dump Road - He requested that someone look at the road and determine if it is a town road or not because there are homeowners on that road. He feels the Town Board needs to research it better.

Kent Gray, County Legislature - Stated that a County wide infrastructure bill was passed regarding water and sewer and that there would be a county wide survey done.

No other comments Supervisor Wall motioned, seconded by Council-member Pneuman to adjourn at 9:00 P.M. All in favor.

Resolution # 58-2000

LOCAL LAW PROHIBITING COMMERCIAL "VENTURES OF ALL KINDS ON THE WATERS OF MARIAVILLE LAKE IN THE TOWN OF DUANESBURG, COUNTY OF SCHENECTADY AND STATE OF NEW YORK.

Section 1: Purpose

This chapter is enacted for the purpose of promoting the health, safety and general welfare of the community by protecting the character of the neighborhood, the tranquillity and the sensitive environmental conditions of the waters and surrounding properties of Mariaville Lake in the Town of Duanesburg.

Section 2: Definitions

As used in this chapter the terms "business" and "commercial venture" shall be deemed to be all inclusive so as to cover every kind of profit-making and not-for-profit enterprise using the waters of Mariaville Lake for the operation of such enterprise.

Section 3: Prohibited Actives

The following shall be prohibited within the Town of Duanesburg on the waters of Mariaville Lake:

It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, corporation, partnership, organization, club or entity of any kind public or private to operate a business or commercial venture upon the waters of Mariaville Lake.

Section 3A: Exceptions

The Town Board may, in its discretion upon good cause shown and in response to a written application, issue one or two day permits for commercial use of said lake waters, one per applicant per calendar year. The Town Board may place such restrictions upon the issuance of such permits as are reasonable to protect the health, safety and welfare of the community.

Section 4: Penalties

Any person or entity who fails to comply with the provisions of this chapter shall be subject to a fine not exceeding two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) or by imprisonment for not more than fifteen (15) days, or both, for each violation. The continued violation of any provision of any section of these regulations shall constitute a separate offense for each and every day such violation of any provision hereof shall continue.

Section 5: Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not effect the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

Section 6: Effective Date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filling with he Secretary of State for the State of New York.

LOCAL LAW PROHIBITING COMMERCIAL "VENTURES OF ALL KINDS ON THE WATERS OF MARIAVILLE LAKE IN THE TOWN OF DUANESBURG, COUNTY OF SCHENECTADY AND STATE OF NEW YORK.

Section 1: Purpose

This chapter is enacted for the purpose of promoting the health, safety and general welfare of the community by protecting the character of the neighborhood, the tranquillity and the sensitive environmental conditions of the waters and surrounding properties of Mariaville Lake in the Town of Duanesburg.

Section 2: Definitions

As used in this chapter the terms "business" and "commercial venture" shall be deemed to be all inclusive so as to cover every kind of profit-making and not-for-profit enterprise using the waters of Mariaville Lake for the operation of such enterprise.

Section 3: Prohibited Actives

The following shall be prohibited within the Town of Duanesburg on the waters of Mariaville Lake:

It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, corporation, partnership, organization, club or entity of any kind public or private to operate a business or commercial venture upon the waters of Mariaville Lake.

Section 3A: Exceptions

The Town Board may, in its discretion upon good cause shown and in response to a written application, issue one or two day permits for commercial use of said lake waters, one per applicant per calendar year. The Town Board may place such restrictions upon the issuance of such permits as are reasonable to protect the health, safety and welfare of the community.

Section 4: Penalties

Any person or entity who fails to comply with the provisions of this chapter shall be subject to a fine not exceeding two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) or by imprisonment for not more than fifteen (15) days, or both, for each violation. The continued violation of any provision of any section of these regulations shall constitute a separate offense for each and every day such violation of any provision hereof shall continue.

Section 5: Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not effect the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

Section 6: Effective Date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filling with he Secretary of State for the State of New York.
