ADOPTION OF THE PROPOSED AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT IN THE TOWN OF DUANESBURG

Representative Fabian offered and moved the adoption of the following resolution; seconded by Representative Macejka:

WHEREAS, this County Board of Representatives adopted on March 10, 1987, Resolution 38-87 implementing the agricultural district review process; and

WHEREAS, reports have been received from the County Agricultural District Advisory Committee, the Commissioner of Planning and from the citizens of the Town of Duanesburg at a public hearing held on May 27, 1987 at the Duanesburg Fire Hall; and

WHEREAS, the final proposed agricultural district in the Town of Duanesburg has been filed with the Clerk of this County Board of Representatives on the 5th day of June, 1987; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this County Board of Representatives, after review of the proposed district, the aforesaid reports and public comments thereon finds that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the County of Schenectady to adopt the agricultural district in the Town of Duanesburg and to submit the agricultural district map and supporting documentation to the Commissioner of Agriculture and Markets for the next step in the approval process.

Resolution #133-91-Councilmember Easton moved and 2nd by Councilmember Potter to authorize Supervisor to sign agreement with animal shelter. Adopted 4 Ayes, Easton, Potter, Lawrence, Park.

Resolution #134-91-Supervisor Park moved and 2nd by Councilmember Lawrence to declare town board lead agency for the purpose of SEQRA review for Right to Farm Law. Adopted 4 Ayes, Park, Lawrence, Potter, Easton.

Resolution #135-91-Supervisor Park moved and 2nd by Councilmember Potter to declare a negative declaration. Adopted 4 Ayes, Park, Potter, Lawrence, Easton.

Resolution #136-91-Councilmember Lawrence moved and 2nd by Councilmember Potter to accept local law No. 11 for 1991, Right to Farm Law. Adopted 4 Ayes, Lawrence, Potter, Easton, Park.

Zoning change application- tabled until next meeting.

Resolution #137-91-Councilmember Easton moved and 2nd by Councilmember Potter, "Be it resolved that glass jars and bottles and tin cans be added to the list of items under mandatory recycling law effective Nov. 15, 1991. No light bulbs, ceramics, window glass or crystal will be accepted. Tin cans to have labels removed and flattened as much as possible. No paint or aerosol cans accepted. All cans, jars, and bottles, to be rinsed out, and bottle and jar tops removed. Adopted 4 Ayes, Easton, Potter, Lawrence, Park.

Councilmember Easton mentioned household hazardous waste disposal Oct. 19, 1991, from 8AM until 2PM, at G.E. Research and Development Center.

Park business- table until 9pm.

George Lent- Rt. 7-spoke of the cost to residents to take trash to Rotterdam. Asked why we are going to pay fees.

Julius Senapole-spoke of problem he has had for a number of years with a part of his property, that he put a wall on. Asked why his problem has not been addressed, for the past few years, that he has requested it be put on the agenda. Mr. Dwyer will execute deed for Mr. Senapole.

John Howard-Thousand Acre Rd.-spoke of property adjoining his, the garbage that remains there, would like town board to take action on this.

Supervisor Park-said owner has been served a summons to clean up property.

Norma Miller-Thousand Acre Rd.-garbage has been there since the beginning of May on the back of a pickup truck.
