Committee Reports:

Highway: Council Members Passonno and Potter met with Highway Superintendent Reed. The crew has been actively working the small storms we have had, and used more sand than usual. All equipment is working/running well. The Brown Road FEMA project is nearly complete and is projected to open Wednesday January 18, 2017. The new Highway Superintendent's truck will be purchased soon from Orange Ford, registered, insured and put on the road on the 20th.

Public Safety: Council Member Leoni has had no communication from UCC. There will be a Town Fire Officer's Meeting on January 18. Pancake Breakfasts resumed at the Delanson Fire Department on Sunday January 5, 2017. Several Town Board Members (Passonno, Potter, Tidball) attended a meeting at the Quaker Street Volunteer Fire Department last night and feel the department is moving in the right direction.

Parks: Council Member Leoni informed the Board that there is discussion of holding a weekly Farmer's Market at Schaefer Park this summer. Research is being done to determine the cost of putting a permanent toilet facility at Van Patten Park.

Sewer Districts #1-3: see attached reports entered from Mr. Warner and Mr. Brown

Technology: Council Member Ganther is waiting for a date to be set for the next cable negotiation meeting. He is also waiting to receive a new Service Contract from OMNIS.

Other:

- Council Members Ganther and Passonno will be meeting with Mr. David Vincent on January 12th regarding the purchase of property from him for a future Municipal Center. He is willing to sell for a reasonable price, but we first need to determine how much land would be required. The Council Members will meet with Mr. Warner and CT Male and report back to the Board next month.
- There was a brief discussion regarding health insurance for part-time Town employees. It may require an amendment to a Town Law. More information needs to be gathered regarding this before any decision can be made.
- The Town Clerk would like to update the Town Hawker/Peddlers Law. It has not be revised since 1967. A copy of the document will be given to the Town Attorney for review and a Public Hearing will be set.
