Public Hearing: Proposed improvements to Mariaville Lake Sewer District No. 2 pursuant to Town Law §202-b.

Town Supervisor Roger Tidball spoke regarding the public notice published in the Gazette. Bill Brown from Delaware Engineering explained the project.

Supervisor Tidball motioned, seconded by Council Member Senecal to open the floor for comments.

Motion carried, 5 ayes

No one wished to comment.

Supervisor Tidball motioned, seconded by Council Member Passonno to close the floor for comments.

Motion carried, 5 ayes

Public Comments on Agenda: Opened by Supervisor Tidball for public comments on agenda items listed in the Business Meeting section of the Agenda. Comments limited to 2 minutes per person.

No one wished to comment on the agenda.

Resolution 115-18: Council Member Ganther motioned, seconded by Council Member Passonno to approve the Town Board Meeting minutes of Thursday, July 12, 2018. Council Member Potter abstained. Motion carried, 4 ayes

Committee Reports

Highway: Superintendent Reed reported that they finished ditching on South Shore Road for the time being but had requests to do more which will happen at a later date. They have started prep work on Mountain View upper end with drainage issues. They started hauling stone in for paving projects on Mudge Road, Delevan Road and upper Mountain View. It will be around \$154,700 from the Chip Fund reimbursement for the motor pave phase which is a scaled back version of what he wanted to do, due to time constraints with contractors. Truck 17 is up & running. There was an issue with the truck when it was hauling rock and a rock flew out and chipped a residents' vehicle. Supervisor Tidball will check with the insurance company regarding the repair. Council Member Passonno reported that he, Council Member Potter and Highway Superintendent Reed all met with Alan Knight regarding Duane Lake. He showed them areas of concern and they will talk with him further and Highway Supervisor Reed will follow up with an email to him.

Public Safety: Council Member Senecal reported that there was a UCC meeting that he was unable to attend and that he is waiting to receive the notes and will follow up at the next meeting.

Parks: Council Member Senecal reported that the summer recreation program has begun and they are happy with the overall condition of the park. He has heard many good comments regarding the park program around town. Supervisor Tidball agreed that he has heard a lot of good things regarding the program and that it is a shame that Town of Princetown has decided not to help fund it even though a number of their residents utilize the park program.

Sewer District #1, 2 &3: Council Member Ganther reported that there were a few issues. The first was an issue with the curbstop, grinder pump and check valve on Weast Road was damaged. They believe it was damaged during the winter when the resident was plowing. The total for that repair from JB's Line cleaning was \$4450.00. Attorney Bakner suggested that the home owner should talk to their insurance company regarding it. Council Member Senecal suggested that their Home Owner's Insurance should cover it. According to the Sewer Law, the resident is responsible as it is on their property and is Sewer District #2 which has been there for around 15 years. Council Member Ganther and Attorney Bakner will get together and send the resident information regarding the law with the bill and suggest that the homeowner should contact their insurance company. Council Member Senecal stated that he had a similar situation with a customer of his business and that it was covered under that persons' home owners insurance. There was also an issue on Cole Road where the county had hired a company to do the road work. A manhole cover was torn up and the cover and a lot of debris fell down into the manhole. There has been some clean up but more is required. The county should be responsible for the bill and clean up. This happened July 4th and they still have not sent a truck to get the remaining debris out. Supervisor Tidball will contact the county to have them cover it.

Council Member Ganther also reported that there was a leak at 8055 Duanesburg Road. Flowers Mountain Construction came out to fix the issue for \$4500.00. Bill Brown from Delaware Engineering

stated that it is under warranty and that we can pay the bill to Flowers Mountain Construction and then that amount will be taken off the final bill from Vacri. Delaware Engineering sent a summary to DEC.

Council Member Ganther also reported there was an issue with standing water on Weaver Road. Bill Brown from Delaware Engineering stated that he took a look at. He believes it is ground water from where the sewer was run through the property and that there will need to be some drainage work done there. Bill will get the town options to fix it.

Every five years they must do a Chemical Bulk Storage Spill Prevention Report which includes a site inspection. Council Member Ganther reached out for quotes at the end of June. He received a quote from McDonald Prime but has not received a quote back from Delaware Engineering yet. Bill Brown will work on getting them a quote.

Bill Brown is also going to get 2 additional quotes on a CAT Walk and railings for SD#3. He will then give the information to the Town Board for approval. They are at the end of budget for SD#3 so it will need to be budgeted for next year.

Council Member Ganther stated that McDonald Engineering has been changed to Prime Engineering. SD#2 Inspections were done. There were nine problems found (which is not a large number considering there are 74 grinder pumps there) three of which have already been repaired. The other six are | & | problems. They will pick a rainy day to get out with the new camera that was purchased for this reason. Jamie at DEC is still very complementary of the work done and the fact that the town bought the camera.

Bill Brown reported that Friday they are going to be replacing a transducer on Friday for SD#3. He also spoke about the Mariaville Project and that next month he will be requesting that the town authorize the funding application for the long term project at Delanson and Equalization Tank. Attorney Bakner let him know that it has already been authorized.

Technology: Council Member Ganther reported that Town Hall will be switching email systems. He wants to make sure all old emails are captured. At the last Broadband meeting it was decided that they would make a Facebook page. The page is Duanesburg Broadband Committee. Congressman Tonko would like to meet with the Broadband Committee and come to a meeting on 8/10, 8/21 or 8/22 if possible.

Other: Supervisor Tidball stated that on August 20th from 4-8PM, The Historical Society will be holding a grand opening of the Duanesburg Historical Research and Archive Center. The Dedication Ceremony is at 6PM.

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF DUANESBURG, NEW YORK (THE "TOWN"), ADOPTED JULY 26, 2018, AUTHORIZING THE FINANCING OF IMPROVEMENTS AND OTHER COSTS RELATED AND INCIDENTAL THERETO, FOR THE MARIAVILLE LAKE SEWER DISTRICT NO. 2; COST AGGREGATE MAXIMUM **ESTIMATING** THE THEREOF TO BE \$400,000.00; APPROPRIATING SAID THEREFORE AND AUTHORIZING THE AMOUNT ISSUANCE OF \$400,000.00 SERIAL BONDS OF THE TOWN TO FINANCE SAID COST.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Duanesburg (by a favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members), as follows:

SECTION 1.

Pursuant to Sections 31.00 and 32.00 of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-A of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (the "Law"), the Town Board of the Town of Duanesburg hereby authorizes the financing of the construction of improvements for the Mariaville Lake Sewer District No. 2, including upgrades to the existing wastewater treatment plant systems in order to achieve the benefits of connection thereto and the installation of equipment, machinery, furnishings, fittings, connections and appurtenances related thereto (collectively, the "Improvements").

SECTION 2

It is determined that this financing is for an assessable improvement and the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is forty (40) years pursuant to Section 11.00(a)(4) of the Law. Pursuant to Section 23.00b-1 of the Law, bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of bonds for this assessable improvement may be renewed beyond five (5) years, provided that such renewals do not extend beyond the period of probable usefulness set forth in this Section 2 of the Resolution.

SECTION 3.

The plan of financing the maximum aggregate \$400,000.00 cost of the Improvements includes the issuance of \$400,000.00 bond anticipation notes or serial bonds and the levy of a tax upon the several lots and parcels of land especially benefited by the Improvements, to pay the principal of and interest on said bond anticipation notes or bonds as the same shall become due and owing. The Town anticipates applying for financing from the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation through the Water Quality Improvement Program (WQIP) which could provide the Town with a grant in the amount of up to 75% of the Improvement costs which, if awarded, would reduce the financing amount of the Improvements.

SECTION 4.

The temporary use of available funds of the Town, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were borrowed, raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized to be expended pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Law for the specific object or purpose described in Section 1 of this Resolution. If such temporary funds are used for any expenditure authorized in this Resolution, the Town intends to reimburse such funds with the proceeds of the tax-exempt borrowing authorized and identified pursuant to Section 1 above.

SECTION 5.

The serial bonds issued to finance the cost of the object or purpose described in Section 1 above shall mature no later than forty (40) years to be measured from the date of the bonds or from the date of the first bond anticipation note issued in anticipation of the sale of such bonds, whichever date is earlier.

SECTION 6.

The Town hereby covenants and agrees with the holders from time to time of said serial bonds of the Town issued pursuant to this Resolution, and any bond anticipation notes of the Town issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, that the Town will duly and faithfully observe and comply with the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), and any proposed or final regulations of the Internal Revenue Service issued pursuant thereto (the "Regulations") unless, in the opinion of Bond Counsel to the Town, such compliance is not required by the Code and the Regulations to maintain the exemption of interest on said obligations from Federal income taxation.

SECTION 7.

The Town Board previously declared the construction of the Improvements is a Type II action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act.

SECTION 8.

Each of the serial bonds authorized by this Resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said serial bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the real property within the Town without legal or constitutional limitation as to rate or amount. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said serial bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the Town by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and notes to mature in such year, and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

SECTION 9.

It is intended that this Resolution shall constitute an official intent within the meaning of Section 1.150-2 of the Regulations to reimburse the Town with the proceeds of the aforesaid bonds or bond anticipation notes to the extent of applicable expenses paid by the Town prior to the issuance of such bonds or bond anticipation notes.

SECTION 10.

Subject to the provisions of this Bond Resolution and the Law, pursuant to the provisions of Section 30.00 of the Law relative to the authorization of the issuance of serial bonds and bond anticipation notes, or the renewals of said obligations and of Section 50.00 and Section 60.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Town Board of the Town relative to authorizing serial bonds and bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and content as to sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said notes, are hereby delegated to the Supervisor of the Town, the chief fiscal officer of the Town. Pursuant to the provisions of paragraph a of Section

56.00 of the Law, the power to determine whether to issue bonds and bond anticipation notes having substantially level or declining annual debt service, as provided in paragraph d of Section 21.00 of the Law, is hereby delegated to the Supervisor of the Town, the chief fiscal officer of said Town. In addition to the delegation of powers described above, the powers and duties of advertising such bonds for sale, conducting the sale and awarding the bonds, are hereby delegated to the Supervisor of the Town, who shall advertise such bonds for sale, conduct the sale and award the bonds in such manner as he shall deem best for the interests of the Town; provided, however, that in the exercise of these delegated powers, he shall comply fully with the provisions of the Law and any other order or rule of the State Comptroller applicable to the sale of municipal bonds.

SECTION 11.

All costs and expenses in connection with the acquisition and development of the object and purpose set forth in Section 1 above, and the financing thereof by the sale of bonds, including but not limited to, the fees and expenses of bond counsel, financial advisors, underwriters, feasibility consultants, counsel for the Town and other professionals, shall be paid to the extent permitted by law from the proceeds of the sale of such bonds.

SECTION 12.

The Town hereby authorizes its Supervisor to enter into any and all agreements, including but not limited to agreements with the Environmental Facilities Corporation, as may be necessary and proper to carry out the intent of the foregoing Resolution.

SECTION 13.

The validity of the bonds authorized by this bond Resolution and of any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be contested only if:

- (a) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the Town is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such Resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication, or

This local law shall be entitled "Fees Required From Non-Residents Reserving Town of Duanesburg Facilities in Town Parks."

Section 2. Authorization.

This local law is enacted pursuant to the Municipal Home Rule Law and Article 16 of the Town Law of the State of New York.

Section 3. Purpose.

The purpose of this local law is to assess a fee of \$40.00 for non-residents who wish to reserve Town facilities in the Town parks.

Section 4. Fees Required From Non-Residents Reserving Town Facilities

The fee for non-residents to reserve facilities in the Town parks owned or operated by the Town of Duanesburg shall be \$40.00.

Section 5 Supersession.

Pursuant to the powers granted by the Municipal Home Rule, this Local Law supersedes all provisions of the Town of Duanesburg Town Code, in so far as such statues are inconsistent with this Local Law and any other laws or regulations of the Town of Duanesburg are superseded to the extent necessary to give this Local Law full force and effect. All other provisions shall remain the same.

Section 6. Severability.

Each separate provision of this Local Law shall be deemed independent of all other provisions therein, and if any provisions shall be deemed or declared invalid, all other provisions hereof shall remain valid and enforceable.

Section 7. Effective Date.

WHEREAS, Local Law No. 5 of 2018 entitled "Trucks Prohibited on Certain Roads" (the "Proposed Local Law") is hereby introduced; and

WHEREAS, adoption of the Proposed Local Law is a type II action under SEQRA.

TOWN OF DUANESBURG LOCAL LAW NO. 5 OF 2018

TRUCKS PROHIBITED ON CERTAIN ROADS

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Duanesburg in the County of Schenectady as follows:

Section 1. Title of the Local Law.

This local law shall be entitled "Trucks Prohibited on Certain Roads."

Section 2. Authorization.

This local law is enacted pursuant to the Municipal Home Rule Law and Article 16 of the Town Law of the State of New York.

Section 3. Purpose.

To protect public health, safety, and welfare by limiting the use of certain roads within the Town by trucks with a gross weight in excess of **3**0,000 pounds. This limitation will help ensure that such trucks are prohibited from using roads that may be steep, narrow and with insufficient road base. The Town Highway Superintendent has observed that such truck usage is damaging to the roadways. Members of the public have also complained that such truck usage has resulted in unsafe situations.

Section 4. Trucks Prohibited on Certain Roads

Trucks, commercial vehicles, tractors, tractor-trailers combinations, tractor-semitrailer combinations, or tractor-trailer-semitrailer combinations with a gross weight in excess of 10,000 pounds are prohibited from traveling upon the following roads. Such exclusion shall not be construed to prevent the delivery or pickup of merchandise or other property along the highways from which such vehicles or combinations are otherwise excluded. This local law shall only apply to the following roads and portions of such roads that are within the Town of Duanesburg. Signs notifying drivers of such prohibition and exclusion therefrom shall be installed on each road or portions of such road identified herein.
